## Parade Line-Ups at Two Locations Gathering at 9:45 AM Friday, July 4

### *Schedule of Events*

#### **9:45 a.m. - Line up for Parade begins (all residents welcome)**

The north parade group will assemble at Old Willow Road and Somerset Lane and march east on Old Willow and south on Wagner Road to the Community Center. The south group will meet at the Ameritech parking lot on Winnetka Road, march west to Riverside Drive, north on Avon, west on Bosworth and north on Wagner Road to the Community Center (Police will be assisting at the Willow Road crossing).

**10:00 a.m. - Bike and Wagon Parade Groups led by Fire-Rescue Vehicles, Police and Scouts march to Willow Park**  
Parade groups will converge at Willow Park. (Park bikes and wagons at the south end for judging - watch for signs.)

Northfield celebrates Independence Day on **Friday, July 4, beginning at 10:00 a.m.** with its traditional, old-fashioned do-it-yourself bike and wagon parade with two groups converging at the Park District/Community Center parking lot at Willow and Wagner Roads. The parade will be led by local Scouts and Police and Fire-Rescue vehicles and converge at the Park District parking lot. **Bikers and strollers are welcome to join the parade anywhere along the routes.** Wear your red, white and blue and decorate your bikes and wagons! ## Celebrate 4th of July in Northfield's New Willow Park

## **It's Official! Willow Road Repaving to Start the Beginning of July**

After a year's delay to allow for completion of the Willow Road Steering Committee's work on the Lakota Study, the Illinois Dept. of Transportation (IDOT) has awarded the Willow Road repaving project to a contractor. Work will begin in early July on resurfacing Willow Road from Sunset Ridge Road to just east of the Edens Expressway. The project also includes traffic signal modernization at Sunset Ridge Road and repairs to the bridge over the Middlefork. The extent of the repaving project on this stretch of Willow Road in Northfield will be the first in well over 20 years. Specific information on lane closures and other construction information will be provided on the Village website, [www.northfieldil.org](http://www.northfieldil.org) as it becomes available from IDOT. The project is due to be completed in mid-October.

## **Stormwater Drainage Information Sought for Community Survey -- Public Meeting to Be Held July 21**

The Village has retained an engineering firm to study stormwater drainage issues in the community. Property owners are asked to complete the Stormwater Drainage Survey mailed to homes and businesses in June as a Special Newsletter. The Survey is also available online at the Village website, [www.northfieldil.org](http://www.northfieldil.org). Survey information is due by **July 14**. Property owners are asked to complete only one survey per household or property. Completed responses will be forwarded to the engineer for inclusion in the study. As part of this study, the Village will also hold a **Public Meeting at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, July 21, at the Village Hall**, 361 Happ Road in Northfield. The engineer will describe the nature of the study, goals and objectives and collect additional information about drainage issues from those attending. Once the engineer has documented drainage problems, they can begin to investigate possible solutions. The more responses received, the more thorough the study.

## **Dominick's Work Moves Forward - Re-opening Expected in September**

Reconstruction work on Dominick's grocery store is progressing with a September Grand Re-Opening anticipated. Dominick's is using this opportunity not only to rebuild the roof but to reconfigure the interior layout of the store. It is also doing some minor facade and signage improvements. Due to the inconvenience caused residents by the closed store, Dominick's announced their intent to locate a temporary pharmacy in a trailer in the store's parking lot. The Village is awaiting information on the temporary pharmacy.

## **Signs of Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)**

Due to the spread of EAB, the Illinois Dept. of Agriculture now recommends removal of known infested trees. Signs of EAB include: branches at the top of the crown dieing, sucker sprouts at base of tree, woodpeckers, "D" shaped holes on tree trunk and dime-sized green beetles. If you or your arborist suspect EAB, call the Village, 847-784-3555.

## **Village Puts Emphasis on Making Capital Improvements in 2008**

### **State Approves Use of Over \$1M in MFT Funds for Repaving Various Village Roads**

The Board approved award of a bid for the 2008 street maintenance program in the amount of \$1.02 million which will come from motor fuel tax money from the State for years 2007 and 2008. Work on Village streets will include pavement patching, reconstruction, repaving, milling, striping, driveway adjustments curb and gutter replacement, sewer replacement and other improvements. Roads included in this year's project include: Balmoral Avenue from Winnetka to Canterbury, Canterbury Lane from Winnetka to the end, Coventry Road from Winnetka to the end, Earl Drive from Old Willow to the end, Enid Lane from Winnetka to the end, Heather Terrace from Pleasantview to the end, Holder Lane from Happ to the end, Old Hunt Road from Sunset Ridge Road to the end, Pleasantview Lane from Old Willow to the end, Red Barn Lane from Winnetka Road to the end, Winnetka Court from Winnetka Road to the end, and Woodland Lane South from Old Willow to the end. Sidewalk work is also planned for Bosworth Lane from Jeffery to Avon. Private roads are being repaved at the homeowners' expense. Residents will be notified of roadwork and changes in traffic patterns with signage and flyers. ### **Installation of New Watermain to Winnetka**

The sale of \$3.5 million in bonds is helping the Village replace two aging watermains with one large main connecting to the Village's main source of water in Winnetka. Thus far, the new watermain has been successfully installed under the Edens Highway and the Skokie Lagoons. Engineers are working on a final part of the project which involves underground work in the intersection of Willow/Happ/Central. Once all the piping has been laid and connections tested, the new watermain is expected to be fully operational by the end of July.

### **Completion of South Happ Road Sidewalk Provides Safe Walking Route to New Trier**

A missing piece of a walkway has been completed, linking two sections of sidewalk on the west side of South Happ Road to provide a safe walking route to and from New Trier West High School and downtown Northfield. Through a Safe Routes to School Committee, the Village is also reviewing other sidewalks in the Village to determine where additional links are needed.

### **Prevent Outages - Contact J.U.L.I.E. before You or Your Contractor Dig**

The Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators (JULIE) is the free Illinois one-call system for locating underground facilities. If you or a contractor will be digging, the person doing the digging is required by State law to contact JULIE by dialing 811 at least 48 hours in advance, not including weekends and holidays. This allows utilities time to identify and mark their buried facilities using paint and/or flags.

## MORE VILLAGE NEWS AND INFORMATION

### **2008 Vehicle Stickers/Tags Required by July 1 - Penalty Added after July 15**

Applications for 2008-09 vehicle stickers/tags have been mailed to all Village residents who purchased stickers/tags last year. Stickers/tags are on sale at the Village Hall, 361 Happ Road from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday for new residents and anyone who was not mailed an application. New stickers/tags must be displayed by July 1. All residents and businesses with vehicles registered, garaged or stored in the Village need to display a 2008 Northfield sticker in the lower left hand corner of the front window (drivers side) of each vehicle including passenger vehicles, rv's and trucks. Motorcycles and trailers receive mountable medallions. The cost for passenger vehicle stickers is \$50 per vehicle, \$35 for motorcycles, \$20 to \$75 for trailers and \$60 to \$120 for trucks. A penalty of 50% of the license fee will be added to the cost of any vehicle sticker/tag purchased after July 15, 2008. Senior citizens who participate in the State's Circuit Breaker Program are eligible for 50% discount on one vehicle sticker/tag per household.

### **Injuries to Children a Good Reason to Leave Fireworks to Professionals**

As the 4th of July holiday approaches, we look forward to celebrating the holiday with parades, barbecues and spectacular fireworks. But Police warn that fireworks are best left to the professionals. Every year, the Office of the State Fire Marshal submits a post Fourth of July survey to Illinois hospitals asking for data on fireworks-related injuries. The results are alarming! In 2007, nearly half of all reported injuries were inflicted on children 16 years old and younger. Of those, more than half were under 10 years old. Injuries ranged from burns to disfigurement to loss of sight or hearing. Firecrackers, bottle rockets, roman candles, sky rockets, etc. are all illegal. Current Illinois law permits use of sparklers, snake or glow worm pellets and trick noisemakers. Protect your children and yourself from harmful fireworks. Visit a local professional fireworks display for a safe and enjoyable 4th of July. If you have any questions about what is permitted, call the Police Dept., 847-446-2131. Don't let your child or a neighbor's child become part of the statistics.

### **Bicycle Safety Key for Riders and Walkers**

Bicycling is a great way to get around town in the summer. For riders and walkers, safety is important. Make sure children understand that pedestrians have the right of way on the sidewalk, that helmets are needed when riding, to look both ways before crossing streets and to use extra caution when approaching driveways. To prevent injuries, riders on sidewalks/paths must signal with a bell or verbal warning such as "on your right/left" when approaching walkers. Bicycles should be registered in case they are lost or stolen. **To register a bicycle at no charge, stop by the Police Dept., 350 Walnut with your bicycle.**

### **Residents Invited to Meet and Discuss Possible On-Street Parking Restrictions in Areas Adjoining Northfield Parks**

The Village's Traffic and Transportation Committee will meet **Wednesday, July 23 at 7:00 p.m. in the Village Hall Council Chambers**, 361 Happ Road to discuss possible parking restrictions including prohibition of all on-street parking during certain sports seasons in the neighborhood south of Willow Park. The meeting has been called in response to requests by residents who live south of Willow Park. The Village Traffic and Transportation Committee will review various alternatives and welcomes input and feedback from Northfield residents. The Committee is seeking ways to ensure that Willow and Clarkson Parks continue to serve as a tremendous asset for the community without imposing excess burden on the residents in the adjoining neighborhoods. All residents are encouraged to attend and give input at this public meeting.

### **Private Improvements on Public Rights of Way - Who is Responsible for What**

The Village Board recently amended the Village Code to clarify responsibility when it comes to improvements made in the parkway or on public rights of way. Improvements made on public property become an issue when a utility, street or sidewalk repair requires work in a public right of way. The types of improvements that can become an issue include decorative mail boxes, sprinkler systems, landscaping, decorative pavement, fencing and electric fencing. Some of the problems caused include having to replace or restore these items when it is not physically possible without going onto private property and difficulty in matching or locating custom or older materials which add to Village costs. To address these issues, the amended code clarifies that the Village is only responsible for restoring parkways in accordance with Village standards. Any atypical improvements made by a homeowner in the public right of way become the responsibility of the property owner to repair or replace. The Village reserves the right to remove sprinkler systems and other obstructions from the right of way if deemed an obstruction. Also, when repairs in the public ROW involve unusual driveway materials such as stamped or colored concrete, specialty material pavers, etc., the driveway shall be repaired at the owner's expense with the understanding that the Village may reimburse the owner for the normal cost of asphalt or concrete as determined by the Village. Residents who choose to make non-standard improvements on public property will be required to sign an encroachment agreement before such improvements are approved. ### Village Adds New Feature Providing Greater Water Account Flexibility and Convenient Payment Via the Website

For residents who embrace the latest technology and the flexibility it affords, the Village Finance Department has added a new customer service program on the Village website. It allows residents to log onto their water/sewer account, view account balances and water usage history, check the status, and pay bills online using their credit card. Residents who would like to take advantage of this new service, can visit the Village website, [www.northfieldil.org](http://www.northfieldil.org) and click on the link, "Water Payments & Inquiry." As a first time user, your 12 digit account number is your password. After a successful login, you will be asked to complete a brief registration form and, at that time, you will be given an opportunity to change your password. Your registration will be processed and you will be notified by email that your internet account has been established and is ready for your secure access. ### West Nile Virus Remains a Threat when Conditions Are Right

During 2002, an outbreak of mosquito-borne West Nile virus in Illinois resulted in more than 800 cases and more than 80 deaths. Temperatures that summer were above normal while in the summers of 2003 and 2004, temperatures were cooler than normal and there were fewer cases of West Nile virus (54 and 60 respectively). How active West Nile virus is in 2008 may be dependent on summer temperatures. While there is no way to predict or control temperatures, reducing the number of mosquitoes in an area can be controlled. By removing sources of standing water around your home, you can control mosquito production thus reducing your risk of West Nile virus. Some actions to take include:

- Get rid of old tires, tin cans, buckets, drums, bottles or any water-holding containers.
- Fill in or drain low places (puddles, ruts, etc.) in the yard.
- Keep drains, ditches and culverts free of weeds and trash so water will drain properly.
- Keep roof gutters free of leaves and other debris.
- Cover trash containers to keep out rainwater.
- Repair leaky pipes and outside faucets.
- Empty plastic wading pools at least once a week and store indoors when not in use.
- Drain unused swimming pools and keep them dry during the mosquito season.
- Fill in tree root holes and hollow stumps that hold water.
- Change the water in birdbaths and plant pots or drip trays at least once a week.
- Store boats covered or upside down or remove rainwater weekly.

### Requirements for New Drivers and Obtaining a Drivers License

The Cook County Sheriff Youth Services Department provides the following information on navigating the new Illinois Graduated Drivers License (GDL) requirements.

#### Permit Phase: Drivers Age 15

- Parent/guardian consent required to obtain a permit.
- Must be enrolled in a state-approved drivers education course and must pass vision and written exams.
- A nighttime driving restriction is in place Sunday-Thursday, 10 pm-6 am and Friday-Sunday, 11 pm-6am.
- Permit must be held for a minimum of nine months.
- Must practice driving a minimum of 50 hours including 10 hours of night driving, supervised by a parent or adult over 21 with a valid driver's license.
- Permit is valid for up to two years.

#### Initial Licensing Phase: Drivers Age 16-17

- Parent/guardian must certify that 50 hours of practice including 10 hours of night driving has been completed.
- Must have completed a state-approved drivers education course.
- A nighttime driving restriction is in place Sunday-Thursday, 10 pm-6 am and Friday-Saturday, 11 pm-6 am.
- For the first year of licensing or until the driver is over 18, passengers are limited to one persons under the age of 20, unless the additional passenger(s) is a sibling/step-sibling, child/step-child.

#### Full Licensing Phase: Drivers Age 18-20

- No age-related restrictions apply except in cases where a driver fails to move from the Initial Licensing Phase to the Full Licensing Phase. Cell phone use for person driving under age 19 is prohibited except in the case of an emergency to contact a law enforcement agency, health care provider, or emergency services.

- Keep grass cut short and shrubbery well trimmed around the house so adult mosquitoes will not hide there.
- Make sure ornamental ponds have fish that eat mosquito larvae.
- Repair window screens.
- When outdoors in the evening, use insect repellent and appropriate clothing to prevent mosquito bites.
